**Males** – black tux pants, white tux shirt, black dress shoes, black dress socks, black bow tie, black tux coat, and solid black vest. Men may purchase this on their own or go through the band boosters to order. Students wishing to purchase their out-fit through the band boosters should see Mr. Carter ASAP for pricing and sizing information. It is HIGHLY recommended that you purchase a tux instead of renting as this will provide substantial savings in only one year. Many places will sell used tuxes at drastically reduced prices – this is yet another savings for ever growing teen-age males. If you have a tux that you have out grown, you may be able to re-sale at the beginning of the year to another student in band. Financial assistance is available. See Mr. Carter for more details.

**Females** – Ladies will be ordering their dress through the OHS Band.
